Semper Excelsius

The 2011-2012 academic year is coming to a close and what a year it has been! The theme for this year was "Semper Excelsius- The Liberty Way." Semper Excelsius" means to always give your best. At Liberty Common School, that is exactly what we do. Excellence is our standard in everything we do – whether it is in our academics, athletics, music, art, extracurricular activities, student life, or character education program. If we are going to do something, we are going to do it to the best of our ability.

This was an amazing year! The elementary continued to click on all cylinders as we were in our second year of adjusting to the additional track of students in each grade level. Once again we provided the K – 6th grade students with the most superb education possible. Though the volume of activity and use of the facility continues to be an added stress for the school, the high standard of education has been maintained and the challenge was met! So impressive is what we are doing that the National Core Knowledge Foundation is going to pilot their new "Official Status" accreditation process on our school. They realize that we are a model Core Knowledge School... one of the best in the nation. We are grateful to Mr. Churchill, the elementary teachers and staff for their commitment to Semper Excelsius.

The first results for CSAP's came out this week and our third graders did very well. The third grade class was 100% at or above proficiency which put us at first in the district and tied for first in the state. We are looking forward to the remaining CSAP results that will be released at the end of the summer. Again, we are committed to providing the best education possible to every student, every year!

Our second year for the Liberty Common High School continues to exceed all expectations as well. Not only did we continue to offer our quality Core Knowledge education to the 7th and 8th graders, but this year we went through 11th grade education for the first time. I have been very impressed. Our 7th – 11th grade students are receiving an unbelievable education. The average score of 11th grade students on their ACT test was a 27.5 out of a possible 36. That is a very high average. Several students scored perfect scores of 36 in content areas with a fair number of students scoring in the 30's for their composite score. We also had our high school students taking the first ever AP tests in Liberty Common High School history. We are excited to get the results back in July. We are confident our students were well prepared and will score well. The future of our high school program appears to be bright. Thanks to Mr. Schaffer and our fabulous faculty and staff for their commitment to Semper Excelsius.

As this year comes to a close, we are sad to announce that a few members of our Liberty teaching family will not be returning next year. Mr. Lavin (High School English), Mr. Leckman (High School Science), Mr. Henderson (5th Grade), Mrs. Colwell (3rd Grade TA) and Elizabeth McFeely (2nd Grade TA) have served our students and this school faithfully and will definitely be missed. We wish them well in all of their future endeavors and are extremely thankful for their work with and dedication to our students.

Looking toward next year, I would like to take this opportunity to urge all of the parents to encourage your children to read on a consistent basis over the summer. There will be a mandatory book assigned for each student to read, but please try to read more than that. Many students return to school at a lower reading level and fluency rate than when they left the year before. This occurs because the children do not read enough, or are not read to enough, over the summer. Please do your child and our school a favor, encourage them to be voracious readers over these next couple of months.

Register Now for the After– School Spanish Program

It is that time of year to begin thinking about registration for the After School Spanish Program for next year. The registration for these classes will be based on a first come first serve process. Once classes are full, there will be a waiting list. Classes are held twice a week from 3:00 to 4:00. The first week of classes will begin on August 20th.

The 2012-2013 After School Spanish model allows for more advancement of levels as the students grow and understand the language better. Students will stay at each level for 2 years. When placing students in the levels, we look at age and ability. Kindergarteners will no longer be able to participate in the Spanish program. Students currently enrolled in the program will receive recommendations from the teacher about which level they should attend. Each case will be individually evaluated so the student is at the level that best meets their needs.

The fee for next year will be \$250 per student per year (for two classes of an hour a week). This equates to \$25 per month. Families with more than one child will pay \$250 for the first enrolled and \$150 for any additional student. A check needs to accompany this registration to hold your child's spot for the class. Refunds for the class will only be administered within the month of August.

End of the Year Medical Reminder

Dear Parents:

As we are coming to the end of the school year, we want to remind parents to pick up all medications from the health office. For the safety of your children, the following procedure will be in place.

A. No medications will be sent home with students. All medications must be picked up by parents by the last day of the school year (including emergency or "as needed" medications, such as Epi-pens, Tylenol, inhalers).

B. If you need to pick up your child's medication before the last day of school, the needed number of pills may be counted out and kept at school in the original container. You may take the remaining pills home in a plastic bag.

C. Any medications not picked up by the last day of school will be disposed of by the school nurse, according to state guidelines. **(We will no longer make reminder calls.)**

We hope everyone will understand this procedure is important for safeguarding your children. (Please pick up the medications between 7:40 a.m. - 3:40 p.m.)

Attention All 5th Grade Parents

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment requires **all students entering the 6th grade to have proof of receiving the Tdap booster vaccine, or a signed exemption.** This is based on the Center for Disease Control recommendations to prevent cases of Pertussis (Whooping Cough).

Please submit clinic documentation to the school health office to verify that your child has been immunized, or submit a signed exemption. The information will be included in your student's school immunization record.
