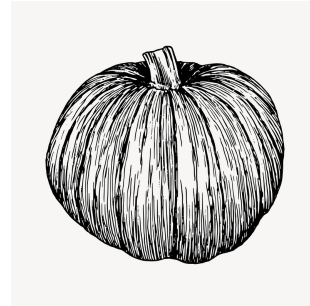

Hello Chatfield Families!

My name is Renee Cameron and I am Chatfield's school counselor. We've had a great start to the school year with each classroom learning about the role of a school counselor, mindfulness, as well as practicing empathy and respect. Our 3rd graders learned about personal safety this month and the importance of reaching out to trusted adults for help. Many of our lessons focus on social-emotional learning (SEL) that supports students' self-awareness, self-management, social-awareness, and social management skills. *Second Step* is the universal curriculum used for SEL learning. Dear Chatfield Families,

I hope you are enjoying the Fall weather! It's always a nice time to go for a drive and check out the changing leaves on the Grand Mesa.

You may have read in the Daily Sentinel that Chatfield was recognized for our growth and achievement on our School Performance Framework that we receive from the state. This data come from our 3rd-5th grade students' CMAS results. Just two years ago, we were on a Turnaround Plan, and now we are at the highest level, performance. We attribute this to our hard-working staff, students, and families.

One major shift we made has been around our Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). Each week, every grade level meets and discusses student data, identifies a key gap in their learning, and makes a plan to reteach the content within a small group setting. We feel this structure helps us really target instruction for all students.
