## District Goals

1. The current year student achievement as measured by District Performance Score (DPS) will meet or exceed the 2021 scores.

1: (3-5 Component) Current year student SPS is 84 and will meet this index or exceed this index by 2 points, 86.

- ELA Assessment Index ( 67.2) will meet or exceed 69 in 2022.

6:K-2 Math District Assessment-Students will maintain or increase the 84% average on the K-2 Math District Assessment.

7: 3-5 Math District Assessment-Students will maintain or increase the 76% average on the 3-5 Math District Assessment.

# Teachers, Parents, Students — Together for Success

## IN THE CLASSROOM

The 1st grade team will work with students and their families to support students success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Communicate with parents on student's academic performance through "What's Coming Up" ,Take-Home-Tuesday folders, progress reports, student agendas, and during parent/teacher conferences.
- Schools newsletters will include tips and tricks to enhance reading and math skills.
- School staff will encourage family home learning activities involving reading and math strategies.
- School's web page will include links to family-friendly websites for building vocabulary and reading and math skills.

## AT HOME

South Larose Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. (Families may have other ideas to add to this list):

- Plan to attend Parent Title I workshops or get information from the parent involvement school contact person.
- Read the school's newsletters and find ways to use the helpful hints at home.
- Go to the school's website for links to other educational websites to encourage family participation.
- Play word games in the car on road trips and find ways to use these words in family conversations.
- Have book talks with child on his/her accelerated reading selections or leveled books.
- Supervise/assist daily with home learning assignments.
- Review and sign student agendas/school correspondence.

## STUDENTS

South Larose Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in all subjects, especially math and reading. Students came up with the following ideas to help make the home and school connection successful:

- Bring home school newsletter/calendars and notes about parental involvement.
- Share vocabulary words and what was learned in class about reading and math.
- Practice reading fluency and read accelerated reader books daily.
- Practice math facts daily. (flash cards, flipcharts)
- Study notes and review home and school work daily.
- Follow school's PBIS expectations and extend those qualities in the home setting.
