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# Our Goals for Student Achievement

## District Goals

1. The current year student achievement as measured by District Performance Score (DPS) will meet or exceed the 2021 scores.
2. In grades 3-8, the current year student achievement as measured by each Assessment Index, will meet or exceed the 2021 scores.

## School Goals

South Larose Elementary is committed to creating a focus on all students, all assessments, and all Louisiana Student Standards through a rich and aligned curriculum.....Essential Practices.

1: (3-5 Component) Current year student SPS is 84 and will meet this index or exceed this index by 2 points, 86.

- ELA Assessment Index ( 67.2) will meet or exceed 69 in 2022.
- Math Assessment Index (63.5) will meet or exceed 65 in 2022.
- Science Assessment Index ( 64.1) will meet or exceed 66 in 2022.
- Social Studies Assessment Index (53.3) will meet or exceed in 55 in 2022.

2: K-2 Fluency- Students will maintain or increase the 97% average on the K-2 High Frequency Word Unit List.

3: K-2 ELA District Assessment-Students will maintain or increase the 79% average on the K-2 District Assessment.

4: 3-5 ELA District Assessment-Students will maintain or increase the 73% average on the 3-5 District Assessment.

5: K-2 Math Fluency-Students will maintain or increase the 100% average on the K-2 Fluency Assessment.

6:K-2 Math District Assessment-Students will maintain or increase the 84% average on the K-2 Math District Assessment.

7: 3-5 Math District Assessment-Students will maintain or increase the 76% average on the 3-5 Math District Assessment.

# Teachers, Parents, Students —- Together for Success

## IN THE CLASSROOM

The Pre-K staff will work with students and their families to support students success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Provide parents with weekly newsletters titled, “Pre-K Update” to inform parents of skills and events.
- Communicate with parents on student’s academic performance through parent/teacher conferences and report cards sent home in November, March, and May.
- School staff will encourage family home learning activities involving reading and math strategies.
- School’s web page will include links to family-friendly websites for building vocabulary and reading and math skills.
- Pre-k students visit computer lab once per week for literacy, *Smarty Ants* and for Math, *Imagine Math*.
- Once per nine weeks a parent-child activity is conducted.

## AT HOME

South Larose Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students’ success in reading and math. (Families may have other ideas to add to this list):

- Read the Pre-K Update and reinforce skills at home.
- Check school calendar daily.
- Go to the school’s website for links to other educational websites to encourage family participation.
- Play word games in the car on road trips and find ways to use these words in family conversations.
- Read daily with my child and discuss the story.
- Supervise/assist daily with home learning assignments.
- Talk with my child daily to build oral language skills.

## STUDENTS

South Larose Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in all subjects, especially math and reading. Students came up with the following ideas to help make the home and school connection successful:

- Talk with my family about skills I am learning in math and reading.
- Bring home our class “Pre-K Update” and notices about school events.
- Complete assigned homework.
- Read daily to or with my parents.
- I will go to school on time each day with a positive attitude about school.
