

Positive Behavior Support

North Park Elementary took on one of the foremost advances in school-wide discipline as the emphasis on school-wide systems of support that include proactive strategies for defining, teaching and supporting appropriate student behaviors to create a positive school environment. Instead of using a slow, little by little approach of individual behavioral management plans, a continuum of positive behavior support for all students within a school is implemented in areas including the classroom and non-classroom settings (such as playground, hallways, cafeteria and restrooms). PBS (Positive Behavior Support) is a positive behavior program focused on creating and sustaining school-wide system of support that improves lifestyle results (personal, health, social, family, work, recreation) for all children and youth by making targeted behaviors less effective, efficient, and relevant, and desired behaviors more functional. The PBS Program incorporates professional development school and district based for all staff (certificated and classified). Teachers integrate PBS lessons in their lesson plans, school wide expectations and survival skills are reinforced daily.
